## **Brush Footed Butterfly**

LEPIDOPTERA: NYMPHALIDAE


**Did you know?** This is the largest family of butterflies, with over 6,000 species!

Did you know? The Monarch butterfly, famous for its beautiful orange and black pattern and large mass migrations, is a member of this family.




*Did you know?* Members of this family are called brushfoots because of their particularly small <u>forelegs</u>. Their front legs are much smaller and covered with little hairs that they use for sensing. Their back legs are the ones mainly used for walking.

## Look and see!



Brush foots have a life cycle that includes a metamorphosis! During this stage, the caterpillar hangs upside down, forms a chrysalis around itself, and after a bit of time comes out as a butterfly!



The brush footed butterflies come in lots of cool colors and patterns! They are often named after things that their pattern resembles, like the striped Zebra Butterfly (*H. ramsdini*).
